# **OIFN Virtual Engagement Project 2021-2022**

- From September 2021 to April 2022, OIFN was fortunate to engage Joanna Goode, a long-time
  participant in the OIFN Community of Practice and Director of Facilitation Wellington Dufferin, in a
  community engagement placement with OIFN, to explore social media trends and gather ideas and
  feedback for meaningful Community of Practice engagement.
- Research and feedback was gathered through various methods:



#### Literature Review

Research to understand the nature of online engagement and learn about effective practices.



# Review of Historical Feedback

Review of evaluations from 6 recent OIFN virtual events to identify trends.



# Virtual Engagement Survey

Online survey shared with the Community of Practice through the mailing list and social media.

57 responses collected



# Focus Groups & Interviews

Small group conversations and 1-on-1 interviews with interested survey respondents.

7 participants

• Joanna's research and feedback from the Community of Practice will inform opportunities for further interaction and connection among the network.


## **Overview of Participants**

#### **Survey Respondents:**

- In total, 57 participants playing a variety of roles responded to the survey.
- Many participants were affiliated with multiple groups, including some not listed, such as consultants, trainers, and education professionals.


#### **Focus Group Participants**

- 18 survey respondents expressed interest in being part of a follow-up conversation.
- 7 people ultimately took part in a focus group or interview.
  - 4 people identified as independent facilitators
  - 1 person identified as a family member
  - 2 people identified as both a facilitator and a family member




## What we learned about the ways we connect

- The majority of respondents shared that they are most familiar with Facebook, YouTube, and Instagram.
- OIFN maintains active Facebook and Instagram pages and will continue to invest in these 2 platforms and explore ways for people to interact.




- Most participants found Zoom to be the most user-friendly form of meeting virtually.
- OIFN will continue to prioritize clear instructions and strong technical support to offer user-friendly experiences.




#### What we learned about how we interact

# **SOCIAL MEDIA & ONLINE PRESENCE**

OIFN's social media channels serve as a strong platform for promoting the values and principles of Independent Facilitation.

Community of Practice members visit OIFN's social media for:

## **VIRTUAL EVENTS**

OIFN has experienced significant success in offering virtual events, which have been characterized as:

- Well-organized (clearly outlined outcomes & instructions and welcoming invitations)
- Time-limited (staying within 60-90 minute time frames)
- Information-rich & inspiring (variety of speakers, valuable content, shared resources)

When it comes to the format and content of events, participants appreciate:

- Personal stories shared by speakers and participants
- Meeting new people and connecting with others with shared vision/values
- Mix of large and small group discussions
- Variety of content (presentations, videos, quotes, etc.)
- Time for asking/answering questions

Possible changes for future events could allow for more interaction among participants both at and in between events.

More time for small groups to report back to the large group Greater diversity of presenters and participants

More ways for people to contribute their gifts and feel "drawn in" Cultivate a spirit of hospitality that is very rich at inperson OIFN events

"Open spaces" and/or opportunities for ongoing connection (breakout groups before/after events, virtual discussion boards, etc.)

# **OVERALL NETWORK ENGAGEMENT**

Feedback indicates that participants appreciate OIFN's big picture focus. OIFN sees Independent Facilitation as one piece of a Framework for an Ordinary, Everyday Life. The stories we tell, the messages we share, and the ideas we care about all reflect our beliefs about full citizenship.

In addition to the "philosophical" content that is shared by OIFN, which grounds our Community of Practice in core beliefs, ethical standards, and safeguards that are distinct and crucial to the practice of Independent Facilitation, participants are looking to OIFN for leadership around capacity building and sustainability of Independent Facilitation in Ontario - both as a career choice and a viable support option for people and families.

# Putting It All Together – Priorities, Opportunities, and Next Steps

- OIFN appreciates all of the suggestions that have been shared. Based on our identified <u>priorities</u> for 2022, we will seriously consider how we may act on as many of these opportunities as possible.
- Many comments expressed the desire for increasing the strength and presence of OIFN, growing the network, and providing more opportunities for connection and networking.
- Following reflection on the feedback received, we have already taken a number of steps to implement suggestions and tailor offerings to better serve the network, including:

Host OIFN events at different times of day and on weekends.	✓ We are offering 2 different opportunities to join our next Reflective Practice Conversation – 1 in the afternoon and 1 in the evening.
Distribute 'what's new this week' in social media to the mailing list, so folks see curated posts.	<ul> <li>✓ We have launch our new weekly newsletter of Social Media Highlights, which is shared with the <u>OIFN Mailing List</u>.</li> <li>✓ An archive of our Social Media Highlights is also being maintained on <u>oifn.ca</u>.</li> </ul>
Offer ways for all Community of Practice members to share content with the network.	✓ We have updated our OIFN Event Endorsement process to encourage allies, partners, and Community of Practice members to promote learning and training opportunities through the network.
	✓ We are encouraged by the interest in more interaction and sharing of ideas, resources, and stories! In addition to our open call for content, we will consider other ways for ongoing interaction through our social media channels.
In addition to learning events, host social gatherings and times for fun.	✓ The OIFN Reflective Practice Planning Group created a unique offering to add some "fun" to our next gathering – Celebrate Inclusion Film Festival
	✓ We will consider further possibilities for social events and increased hospitality at our virtual gatherings.
